HIKING TRAILS

Trail "Hidden Waterfall"

One of the most beautiful hiking trail in Dilijan is the Hidden Waterfall trail. It is called hidden because it is safely hidden behind rocks, and we discovered it only recently! The path to it starts from the monastery of Haghartsin, this is the only road leading to the forest. After 1.5 km you will see a wooden bridge that was built for a safe crossing of the river. As soon as you hear the murmur – you are close!

Trail "Parz lich - Goshavank"

This is one of the most popular hiking routes, as it includes the most beautiful locations of Dilijan National Park – Lakes Parz and Gosh. The route starts from Lake Parz and passes through the forest where the ancient khachkars are hidden. At the end of the trail you will enjoy a panoramic view of the village of Gosh and the fabulous monastery of Goshavank.

The trail of Medieval Monasteries

The trail passes through a dirt road, grassy meadows, dense groves and rivers, connecting two stunning historical monuments – Matosavank and Juhtakvank. These abandoned monasteries of the XII - XIII centuries were active cultural centers in the past, and now they have practically merged with nature.

DILIJAN LAKES



LAKE PARZ

Lake Parz (translated from Armenian as "transparent") is located at an altitude of 1350 meters above sea level. Here you can rent a catamaran or ride a zip line across the lake. Not far from Lake Parz there is a center for the restoration of the Caucasian red deer – there you can see these red Book animals up close.



LAKE GOSH

From a bird's-eye view, Lake Gosh resembles a crystal drop lost in the wooded mountains of Dilijan National Park. The way to the lake passes through a dense thicket, and on the way you can see ancient khachkars.

CAUCASIAN RED DEER BREEDING CENTER

The Armenian branch of the World Wide Fund for Nature and the Ministry of Environment of Armenia have been implementing the Project entitled Reintroduction of the Caucasian Red Deer in Armenia. The overall goal of the Project is to restore the population of the Red Deer in Armenia. It is implemented at the Caucasian Red Deer Breeding Center by breeding the introduced animals and then releasing deers into the wild.

MOUNTAIN Dimats

Dimats is a mountain peak in the Tavush region of Armenia. It rises above the surrounding forests at 2378 meters. Mount Dimats is visible from almost anywhere in the city of Dilijan and the National Park. The mountain is covered with green meadows and the view from the top will take the breath of any traveler!

MOUNTAIN Airikar

Mount Airikar has a height of approximately 2610 meters above sea level. The name of the mountain is translated from Armenian as "Widow's Stone". The top of Airikar looks like a rock, it is not easy to conquer it - but the view from the mountain is worth it.
